USEFUL INFORMATION BEFORE YOU START

- Entrance to all the venues is free. Venue owners may choose to collect for a charity of their choice, and you are welcome to contribute to their charity or not as you see fit.
- Please respect the wishes of garden owners with regard to dogs, which should be kept on a lead at all times, unless otherwise specified.
- Venues are open both days unless specified: check to avoid disappointment.
- Walk or cycle around the trail as far as possible as parking in the village is limited; the 2 public car parks in the centre will be free on both days.
- 1 on the map indicates our information point in the porch of the Free **Church** in the High Street, where you can pick up a leaflet and get directions from the knowledgeable residents. Gallery BN5 in the High Street will also be another information point should there be a temporary absence of staffing at the main point.
- Garden venues are numbered 1-20, with numbers showing their location on the centrefold map. Community institutions and venues, which are not private gardens, are labelled A-I. These are: the Henfield Hall, the Free Church, the Henfield Club, The Shed, Red Oaks, Henfield Haven, St. Peter's Church, St. Peter's School and the Henfield Library. All numbers are colour coded to show on which days the venues are open.




